Our Program

The program offers prenatal and parent/child services including home visits, workshops, and parent/toddler groups. Our parent educators provide:

Culturally based information about prenatal health, childbirth, child development, and child rearing.

Activities that help families encourage their keiki's interest in learning.

Participation

Participation in the program is for children of Hawaiian or part-Hawaiian ancestry and is completely voluntary.

Our goal is to work with families of Native Hawaiian children as early as possible.

Preference is given:

To prenatal families

To families expecting a first or second child

To families of children up to six months old

Program Concept: Ho'olohe - "Listening"

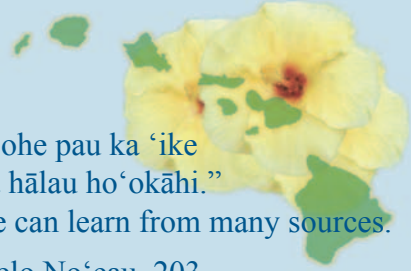
This is an illustration of Ho'olohe, an important communication skill.
